What does becoming a member of the Secretariat entail?

The Secretariat is the elected body of LAC members who accept the responsibility for making the decisions needed to ensure that the day to day organization of LAC runs smoothly. Nominees should be familiar with the constitution of LAC which is available on the website (www.leicestercursillo.org) The Lay-director chairs the meetings, usually 10 per year with our current work load, but as this eases we will be looking to reduce this frequency.

Secretariat members also form a link with the Fourth Day Community, (LAC members who carry out specific tasks on behalf of the Secretariat) to ensure that they have the training, information and resources they need to fulfill these roles effectively.

As LAC is also a registered Charity, members of the Secretariat are also responsible to the Charity Commissioners for the proper financial operation of the organization. In the main this simply means ensuring that the funds we raise are spent purely on achieving the objects of LAC, which is running weekends and providing an ongoing support network for those that have attended them. Our Treasurer prepares an annual budget and keeps us informed of how we are doing at each meeting.

LAC operates under license from the British Anglican Cursillo Council (BACC) this means that very occasionally we will receive information from them which we must respond to (we have a BACC representative who attends their meetings). With this in mind it is good for all the Secretariat members to do a Cursillo Leaders Workshop, should it be required the course fees can be paid for from LAC funds.

I have read the above and agree to allow my name to be put forward for election to the Secretariat for the coming year.

Leicester Anglican Cursillo Job Description for Secretary

The role of the Secretary is to provide administration support to the Lay Director and the Secretariat and to ensure that LAC records are always kept up to date Duties include: -

- Attend Secretariat meetings and to take the minutes.
- Minutes to be circulated to members as soon as possible, usually by email or by post if required.
- Keep Secretariat members informed of any developments between meetings.
- Correspondence and amending/creating of any documents as and when required, resulting from a Secretariat meeting or request from the Lay Director.
- Ensure that records of Secretariat members are kept up to date, confidential and when appropriate deleted/destroyed in accordance with the GDPR policy.
- The Charity Commission is kept up to date with Secretariat Members (Trustees) and the annual report is completed. Ensure that Trustee Forms are completed by members and filed appropriately. Any amendments to the Constitution should also be uploaded to the Charity Commission.
- BACC are kept up to date with change of officers of LAC.
- Write to the Bishop prior to the weekends requesting him to send greetings to participants.
- Any other administration tasks, as and when required.
